
LEARNING MATTERS

Parents of students in Year 7 will by now be aware that we have started to transform the way we approach teaching and learning at NHSPA. Based on research over the last 10 years and guided by the expertise of academics from the University of Sydney, the school is moving to a more personalised, targeted approach to teaching and learning. "The Learning Disposition Wheel" (LWD) with its nine attributes or skills, provides students with a framework to identify their existing learning strengths and areas for further development. Parents will have an opportunity to hear their child discuss their learning on September 20 during a student led conference at home. Year 7 are busily compiling their e-learning portfolios in preparation for this exciting event.

NHSPA SOUNDS OF MUSIC


Year 11 Music 1 have just completed a class Song Writing project as part of their studies in Popular Music.


