SCHOOL UNIFORM MATTERS

The NHSPA school community, which includes students, parents and staff has agreed that Newtown students will have a school uniform. The community believes that wearing school uniform fosters school pride, assists in the development and maintenance of a positive tone and ensures a sense of equality irrespective of a student's personal circumstances. The school uniform also helps to increase security for students travelling to and from school and allows staff to quickly identify anyone who is trespassing on school property.

While students may, on occasion, have valid reasons for being out of uniform, some students are coming to school out of school uniform and without a note of explanation from parents. From next term uniform will be monitored closely. The school will conduct a regular uniform blitz, parents will be informed of uniform breaches and students repeatedly out of uniform may be prevented from representing the school in academic or sporting competitions.

Current COVID restrictions prevent parents from visiting the uniform shop, but enquiries and orders can be made via email. School uniforms can be supplied by the school if parents are experiencing financial hardship.


