#### YEAR 12 WE ARE SO PROUD OF YOU!

HSC examinations are almost at an end at NHSPA. Despite a disrupted year with many disappointments, Year 12 has risen to the occasion magnificently. Not only have they shown themselves to be a positive, resilient group of young adults in the lead up to their exams but their maturity and willingness to comply with all the additional requirements related to COVID has been appreciated by the HSC Exam supervisors. As I mentioned at graduation, the 2020 cohort is a very special group of students who are ready to take on the world!



#### PERFORMING ARTS PRACTICAL EXAM RESULTS

Our students have achieved wonderful results in HSC practical exams in Dance, Drama, and Music. In Dance a total of eighteen stunning dance students were nominated for inclusion in the Dance Showcase "Callback", while six of our highly talented musicians received nominations for "Encore" and thirteen standout drama students were nominated for inclusion in "OnStage". Congratulations to all Performing Arts students for their hard work and fine achievement.

#### YEAR 7 PARENT/STUDENT FEEDBACK

Thank you to Year 7 parents and students for your feedback on some of the new initiatives we are trialling this year. Your comments have provided us with valuable information which we will use to inform our approach in 2021. The survey indicated that while parents were generally supportive of the school's focus on teaching students to become independent learners and thinkers, some parents have missed the opportunity to interact with teachers and receive feedback at parent/teacher evenings due to COVID restrictions. Students too have given us valuable feedback about the Orientation Program and the need for increased opportunities for them to make new friends in the early weeks of school. With COVID restrictions easing this term, parents will again be able to attend presentations and end of year activities if it can be managed given social distancing requirements. All parents will receive yearly student reports next month. Parents who have concerns about their child's academic progress or wellbeing are encouraged to contact the school where they will be referred to the appropriate member of staff.

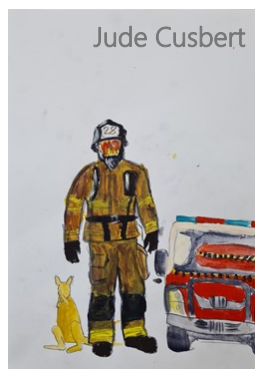
## Year 9
