SCHOOL STAFFING

Most parents would be aware of the severe staffing shortage faced by all schools across the state. Unfortunately, this issue, combined with teacher absence due to illness, is impacting not only our learners but also on the smooth running of the school.

Please be advised that we are doing everything we can to ensure that classes are covered with a teacher who has subject expertise. However, despite our best efforts this is not always possible. It is hoped that the situation will improve next term.

YEAR 7 PHONE FREE FRIDAYS

There has been a considerable amount of media coverage recently about the distractions caused by the use of mobile phones in classrooms and in the playground. For this reason, the school has been trialling a phone free Friday initiative to encourage students to reduce their use of phones, particularly at recess and lunch. Feedback from parents has been overwhelmingly positive and Year 7 have adjusted well to not accessing their phones during the day. To determine our next steps, parents, staff, and students will be consulted and findings will be communicated next term.

YEAR 10 CAREERS EXPO AND SUBJECT SELECTION

Year 10 and 11 information sessions held last week, provided a valuable opportunity for students and parents to learn about the HSC credential and to make informed decisions about courses and patterns of study in the senior years. This year our students were fortunate to attend an "in -house" Careers Expo to assist them to focus on future education pathways and possible career options.

A big thank you to our Careers Advisor, Ms George, for organising the Expo and to Deputy Principal, Peter Shields, for his informative presentation on HSC requirements. Thank you as well to the Executive who were on hand to discuss course offerings and subject information.

THE SOUNDS OF MUSIC

AUSTRALIAN SCHOOL BAND AND ORCHESTRA FESTIVAL

The NHSPA Jazz Orchestra won Gold in the Australian School Band and Orchestra Festival at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. After nearly two years away from state-wide competitions, it was wonderful to see the ensemble gaining recognition for their hard work in maintaining their high performance standard.

Their section, *Premium Stage Band*, was the highest level for a stage band and included ensembles from both public and private schools across the state. One of the 4 pieces they performed was an incredibly complex Australian work in 7/4, called 'Cass'.

The audience's reaction to the students' challenging repertoire was outstanding and the adjudicator gave special mention to the ensemble's professional level of musicianship and attention to detail when awarding them with their gold plaque.



CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAM

What makes Newtown such a unique school are the opportunities we provide for all students to explore their creative talents through our extensive co-curricular program. As there are no additional funds to run such programs, we are reliant on annual fees charged to parents.

Fees collected are used to cover the cost of the employment of outside tutors, many of whom are leading practitioners in their field. 
Technology Mandatory

ALUMNI SUCCESS STORY

Bree Masters, a former NHSPA student, has seen international success since finishing school with us in 2012. She is very proud of our school and loved her time here. Bree hopes sharing her story will inspire Newtown students to work hard and ever give up on their dreams...



Whilst still at NHSPA Bree was Athletics, Swim and Cross-Country Champions, and Bligh Champion in Athletics. She represented Newtown at State level becoming the 400m State Champion and making the top 3 in the 200m and 100m sprints. Bree went on to win over 25 Australian Titles in Life-Saving Sprints and Beach Flags. She

represented Australia in Surf Life-Saving many times becoming World Champion in Beach Sprints (opens) and World Champion in Juniors for Flags and Beach sprints. Bree holds the record for the most gold medals won at a single world championship on the beach (6 Gold).

In 2019 Bree changed to track and made the Australian Track Team, winning many track events in her first year. Although very narrowly missing out on the Olympics in Tokyo by 1/100th of a second, she persevered and has recently represented Australia in multiple international athletic events (2022 World Athletic Titles in USA & 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham).

Bree competed in both the 100m and the 4x100m relay at the Commonwealth Games, placing 6th and 4th respectively. In the World 2022 Titles, Bree ran 30th in the world and was the only female selected to compete for Australia in the event!

Newtown High School of the Performing Arts is the only school in NSW where students have the opportunity to take Classical Ballet at HSC level and we are proud to be able to support our exemplary Classical Ballet dancers.

Congratulations to our 2022 Year 12 Dance cohort who have been awarded 47 HSC Dance 'Callback' nominations. 'Callback' recognizes exemplary performances by HSC candidates during the HSC practical examinations and our dancers were awarded 19 Core Performance, 11 Core Composition, 18 Major Study Performance and 1 Major Study Composition nomination with 9 dancers being awarded nominations in all three areas. This is a fantastic achievement and we congratulate each and every one of our dancers on their efforts.

Year 8 Gala Day Year 8 thoroughly enjoyed their annual Gala Day. Students selected a particular sport; including European handball, Soccer, OzTag, Netball, AFL and Basketball and competed against the other Bligh Zone schools at an array of different venues. It was a

wonderful day assisted by Year 9 PASS (Physical

Activity and Sport Studies) and Year 10 student coaches and referees.







Year 10 attended the *Bstreetsmart* excursion to Qudos Bank Arena as part of their "Personal Safety" course unit. Developed by the Trauma Service of Westmead Hospital students watched a crash scene scenario and learnt the processes that need to be undertaken by emergency services.

Throughout the day, students engaged with a variety of information stalls. Some of our students entered the Bfilmed competition that is held every year by Bstreetsmart. To enter, participants must send a short film no longer than 3 minutes. The film must have a message relating to road safety for youth as drivers, passengers, or pedestrians (e.g., texting, drugs/alcohol, fatigue, distraction). Our students were creative, with multiple submissions making the top 5 finalists. Amy Forchet, Edie Krone & Evie LeMay's group won the competition receiving a trophy and \$2000 towards the school. Currently studying "You Be The Coach," students have collaboratively constructed physical activity lesson plans to teach students from Newtown Public School. Camp was a very unique, fun and challenging experience. While there were many challenges such as a broken down bus and activities in the rain, those were completely




